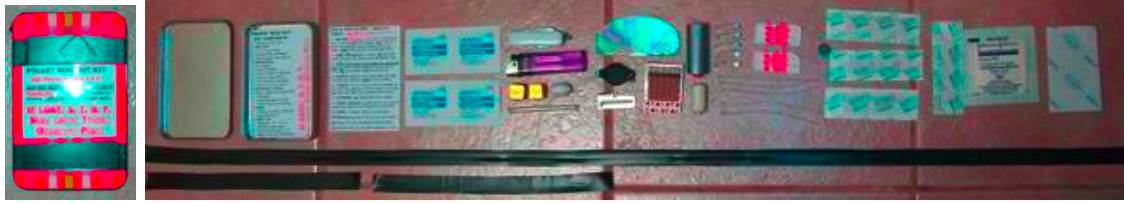


Pocket Bug-Out Kit!



You may have heard of survival kits that fit into a metal Altoids box. We used a metal box 3" x 5" and $\frac{3}{4}$ " thick. Here's what we put into it:

| () 2-Blade pocket knife | () Salt packets (2) |
| () BIC lighter (see-thru side) | () Small plastic ties (5) |
| () Bouillon cube (2) | () Tiny compass |
| () Dental floss with needles | FIRST AID KIT |
| () Half a CD (signal mirror) | () Bandaid, $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" (4) |
| () LED keychain flashlight | () 3" x 3" compress |
| () P-38 military can opener | () Moleskin for blisters |
| () Paper matchbook | () Electrical tape, 5' (wound around can to seal it) |
| () Roll of duct tape | |

The label on the front of the can reads "Pocket Bug-Out Kit":

- DO Phone home ASAP!
- **Water not included w/Kit**
- Priority #1! You need 2-3 quarts/day for drinking!
- Don't drink contaminated water!
- **If LOST: S. T. O. P. Stay calm! Think! Observe! Plan!**

This can fits nicely in a jacket pocket. Weight is 6 oz. Cost was about \$5.

This kit doesn't have:

- Snare wire, which most folks don't know how to use.
- Fishing gear, which most folks think takes a pole and reel.
- Coiled-up saw blade, which breaks with any heavy use.
- Whistle, which was too big to fit in.
- Water container, also too large to fit in.
- What you think you need instead - **make your own kit & test it!**
